Reminders:

1. Gates, Garage Doors and Windows – Please look out for one another. If you see your neighbor's garage door open, it's okay to say something. Take care to keep your gates and garage doors closed. During the summer it's nice to have your windows open, however, please be extra vigilant that you stay safe.
2. Yard Maintenance – Please make sure you maintain both front and back yards of excessive weeds and long grass. We don't want to invite unwanted rodent guests! This is a great recipe for a natural weed killer:

1. Pour 1 gallon of white vinegar into a bucket. Everyday 5-percent household white vinegar is fine for this weed killer. You won't need higher, more expensive concentrations such as 10 or 20 percent. It may take two or three days longer to kill the weeds with the lower concentration, but they will die.
 2. Add 1 cup of table salt. Stir the solution with a long-handled spoon until all the salt dissolves completely.
 3. Stir in 1 tablespoon of liquid dishwashing soap. This will act as a surfactant and make the vinegar and salt solution adhere to the weeds more efficiently. Blend thoroughly.
 4. Funnel the weed killer into a plastic spray bottle.
 5. Drench the weeds with the solution on a dry, sunny day. Coat all surfaces well with the spray. Any plants soaked with this solution will die within several days. They won't be back and nothing else will ever grow there.
 6. Funnel any leftover weed killer into an empty plastic container. Cap it tightly. Label it clearly and store in a cool, dark spot indefinitely.

“A recipe is a story which ends with a good meal!”

Sadly, the Washington State Fair has been cancelled this year, however we can celebrate at home with a Traditional Funnel Cake recipe:

Ingredients

- 2 cups 2% milk
 - 3 large eggs
 - 1/4 cup sugar
 - 2 cups all-purpose flour
 - 2 teaspoons baking powder
 - Oil for deep-fat frying
 - Confectioners' sugar
 - Lingonberry jam or red currant jelly

Directions

- In a large bowl, combine the milk, eggs and sugar. Combine flour and baking powder; beat into egg mixture until smooth.
 - In a cast-iron or electric skillet, heat 2 inches oil to 375°. Cover the bottom of a funnel spout with your finger; ladle 1/2 cup batter into funnel. Holding the funnel several inches above the skillet, release your finger and move the funnel in a spiral motion until all the batter is released. Scrape funnel with a rubber spatula if needed.
 - Fry until golden brown, 1 minute on each side. Drain. Sprinkle with confectioners' sugar. Add jam or jelly.
